How to Play Game Rules



Game 1:

1. Print a Duck for each child and only one Goose on cardstock or heavy paper.
 2. Hand a Duck to each child.
 3. Children can print their name on the back of the Duck.
 4. All the children sit in a circle with their Duck. Make sure there is enough room for a child to run around the circle of children.
 5. The youngest child starts first by walking around the circle saying Duck for each child's head that is touched.
 6. When the child decides on a child to pick, they say Goose, and immediately the sitting child stands up and chases the other child around the circle to where the child was sitting. If the child tags the other child before the child sits down, they get to take their Duck away.
 7. The child that was picked has their chance to walk around calling Duck, Duck, Goose.
 8. The game continues until all the children have had a turn and one child has the most Ducks.
 9. The child with the most Ducks gets the Goose.
 10. Children can look at the names of the Ducks to see who's Ducks they have.
- Optional: Print the game coloring page and have the kids color their ducks and use for the game.

Game 2:

1. Print a Duck for each child and only one Goose on cardstock or heavy paper.
 2. Laminate the Goose for durability.
 3. Hand a Duck to each child.
 4. Children can print their name on the back of the Duck.
 5. All the children sit in a circle with their Duck. Make sure there is enough room for a child to run around the circle of children.
 6. Place a piece of sticky tape on the back of the Goose.
 7. The youngest child starts first by walking around the circle holding the Goose saying Duck for each child's head that is touched.
 8. When the child decides on a child to pick, they say Goose and stick the Goose on the back of the child, and immediately the sitting child stands up and chases the other child around the circle to where the child was sitting. If the child tags the other child before the child sits down, they get to take their Duck away.
 9. The child that was picked has their chance to walk around calling Duck, Duck, Goose.
 10. The game continues until all the children have had a turn and one child has the most Ducks.
 11. The child with the most Ducks gets the Goose.
 12. Children can look at the names of the Ducks to see who's Ducks they have.
- Optional: Print the game coloring page and have the kids color their ducks and use for the game.

Game 3:

1. Print the Goose on cardstock or heavy paper. You don't need the ducks for this game.
2. Laminate the Goose for durability.
3. All the children sit in a circle. Make sure there is enough room for a child to run around the circle of children.
4. Place a piece of sticky tape on the back of the Goose.
5. The youngest child starts first by walking around the circle holding the Goose saying Duck for each child's head that is touched.
6. When the child decides on a child to pick, they say Goose and stick the Goose on the back of the child, and immediately the sitting child stands up and chases the other child around the circle to where the child was sitting.
7. The child that was picked has their chance to walk around calling Duck, Duck, Goose.
8. The game continues until all the children have had a turn.
9. The last child gets the Goose.
10. Keep the children entertained by printing the game coloring page for them to color.
